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# **Annual Report Session: 2022-23**

The college is looking forward to come up as an institute to provide conductive environment for preparing competent, value added and patriotic students of integrity of par excellence to meet global standards for societal development.

## **Program Includes:**

- The college offers courses leading to undergraduate, postgraduate, doctorate, and diploma.
- It is divided into five academic fields: Education, Science, Journalism, Arts, And Commerce.
- Three-year programme at Khushabhau Thakrey Patra connected with **BJMC** Since 2006, Patrakarita Avam Jansanchar Vishwavidyalaya in Raipur has been operational.
- There are **nine research centers** at the college.
- In order to provide high-quality education, the College guarantees a decentralised and participatory form of government.
- The college has a number of operational committees with an emphasis on academics and the NAAC.

#### Facilities available in the college-

- Wi-Fi on campus has been increased from 25 Mbps to 50 Mbps.
- All post-graduate topics have a departmental library, **SOUL Software**, **N-List**, **e-Book subscriptions**, and new textbooks available at the Central Library.
- Gym outfitted with contemporary apparatus.
- 100-seater women's hostel, auditorium, conference rooms, well-equipped labs, language lab, etc.
- Jawara Juice Center and Kalyan Amritasan Refreshment Center.
- The PNB ATM on the college grounds, as well as the separate parking areas for staff, boys, and girls.
- Where necessary, CCTV cameras are installed, and generators are accessible.
- On the college grounds, there is a nine-acre playground featuring four turf fields, a volleyball court, and a basketball court. Cricket matches at the state and intercollegiate levels are played.
- Radhakrishinan Garden, Sarvdharm Sambhav, and independent administrative blocks.

## Remarkable achievements of the current session: 2022-23

**Institution has nine research centres** are located in Kalyan Post Graduate College in the following disciplines: **Education, English, Hindi, Commerce, Sociology, Political Science, Economics, Chemistry, and Mathematics.** The institution has **33 research guides**, and our research centre also has 58 research guides from other institutes registered. Researchers work in a variety of thrust areas, conducting both basic and applied research. There are **220 research scholars** enrolled at the college's research centres.

- a. The Faculty of Education is the department with the most research guides—13 total. It is Hemchand Yadav University's largest research centre.
- b. The institution implemented welfare programmes for both teaching and non-teaching staff. Examples include the **Employee State Insurance Corporation (ESIC)**, medical leave, travel reimbursements, fee concessions for their wards, festival advances, Employee Provident Fund (EPF), CPF, and earned leave.
- c. Best Practices: The Jawara Ras Center provides advantages to the community, Chauhan Cricket Academy trains athletes, staff members engage in philanthropic work, Departmental Society Activities, Village Connect, and other initiatives fall under the category of institutional social responsibility.
- d. **Social/Communal Harmony**: this includes events like Garba, Holi, Diwali, Ganesh Puja Festivals, birthday celebrations, Smriti Diwas, and so on.

#### 2. Infrastructure Enhancement-

- a. Expenditure for infrastructure augmentation worth **Rs. 59,91,906**/-were finished during this session. These maintenances comprised garden, computer, and website.
- b. Expenditure on maintenance of academic facilities office equipment, library books, laboratory apparatus, etc. worth **Rs. 7,72,366/-**
- c. Expenditure on physical facilities worth Rs. 9,91,894/-
- 3. For student support Student-focused committees, such as the discipline committee, internal complaint committee, anti-ragging committee, student grievance committee, and others, contributed to ensuring a democratic and engaged learning environment on college campuses. 651 students benefited from government scholarships totaling Rs 11266370/- during the 2022–2023 academic year thanks to a variety of government and non-government grants.
- 4. Workshop, short term courses, conferences, webinar, seminar, and faculty development programme (FDP): During this session, 75 teaching faculties have participated in short-term courses, faculty development programmes, webinars, and online seminars.
- 5. **Departmental society activities** Departments ran a number of extensions programmes during this session, including the **Ann Daan and Vastra Dan Yojana**, **Tree planting**, **Health checkup camps**, the Political Science Department's Shahid Vinod Choubey Scholarship, **the Botanical Society's "Best from Waste material,"** etc.
