### **ALUMNI FEEDBACK ON CURRICULUM (2018-19)**

Feedback from alumni were taken from alumni during alumni meet in college.83% of alumni strongly agree that syllabus created interest to pursue post graduation and research which is clear from student progression report. Most of the students opted for higher studies in college. 74% agreed that syllabus helped in intellectual development. 69% agreed that syllabus was updated and is as per the local/ National and Global needs. Certificate courses were added for skill development. Only 76% marked that elective papers helped in developing technical and vocational skills. 78% students agreed that curriculum contributed in inculcating professional and moral/ ethical values and is relevant. Only 52% students satisfied with internship/ field work/ project. 88% students are satisfied with the seminar/ workshops/ guest lecture etc.

## PARENTS FEEDBACK ON CURRICULUM (2018-19)

Syllabus intellectually stimulates was observed by 78% and 8% denied it. 74% found that curriculum is need based. Educational Objectives are not cleared to 22% of the parents, 72% of parents fully understand and satisfied with the learning objectives, 84% parents satisfied with the knowledge level of their children. Inclusion of modern trends in curriculum was considered satisfactory by 76% of the parents, 78% appreciated that their children search for other resources. 48% of the parents felt that syllabus should be revised. Only 16% of the parents interacted with teachers, 79% parents marked that curriculum helped their children in learning technology. Employability of the syllabus was considered satisfactory by 54% of the parents. 76% of the parents felt that curriculum inculcates human values.

58% of teaching staff consider that provision for professional development are non-discriminatory and fair.16% consider it as not fair.72% are not satisfied with the financial support by institution for projects and research.76% of teachers consider that administrative and academic environment is teacher friendly.91% teachers agree that they have freedom to adopt new methodologies, strategies and techniques of teaching.58% teachers agree that institution encourages teachers for participation in seminars/workshops and conferences.43% agree that they have freedom for suggestion and modification in curriculum.92% teachers are satisfied with the infrastructural facilities for them. Only 51% teachers are satisfied with the encouragement they get for their efforts.42% teachers are not satisfied with the redressal of their grievances and 68% teachers are satisfied with the ICT facilities in the institution.

## STUDENT FEEDBACK ABOUT COLLEGE (2018-19)

- 1. Quality of teaching learning process is considered Good by 74% of the undergraduate students and 19% of students considered teaching learning process need improvement. 79% of post graduate students considered it as Good.
- 2. 55% undergraduate student agreed that their grievances are redressed always. On the contrary 80% post graduate students agreed that grievances are redressed on priority basis.
- 3. 78% of the students considered learning opportunities provided by college satisfactory. only 10% considered it as excellent and only 9% considered it as General. 86% of postgraduate students considered it as satisfactory and only 15% considered it as General.
- 4. 65% of the students agreed that curriculum in skill based and 20% considered it as upgraded and only 8% considered it as general. 70% of the post graduate students agreed that curriculum is skill based 25% considered it as upgraded and only 9% considered it as General.
- 5. 91% of students marked infrastructure of the college including ICT as very good only 6% considered it as general. 93% of the post graduate students agreed that infrastructure is good only 5% considered it as satisfactory and 2% considered it as general.
- 6. 49% of the under graduate students agreed that e-resources in library is sufficient and 40% of the students has marked it as general and only 8% considered it as insufficient. 56% of the post graduate students agreed that e-resources in library is sufficient. 35% agreed for general and 12% considered as insufficient.

# STUDENTS FEEDBACK ABOUT TEACHERS (2018-19)

1. Teacher's quality of teaching has been considered good by 75% of the undergraduate students. 24% considered it as average. 68% of the post graduate students considered it as good and only 12% considered it as average.

- 2. Subjective knowledge of teacher and ability to generate curiosity among students is considered good by 77% of the student and 20% considered it as average, 76% of the post graduate student considered it as good and 26% considered it as average.
- 3. Teacher's ability to identity strength and weakness of students has been considered Good by 66% of the students.30% considered it as average. 63% of the post graduate student considered it as good and 32% of post graduate students considered it as average.
- 68% of the undergraduate students considered teachers preparation for the class is good, 22% of the students considered it as average, 58
  % of the post graduate students considered it as good only 26% students considered it as average.
- 5. 88% of students agreed that teachers are available in class and outside the class for motivation, skill development etc. only 8% considered it as average, 82% post graduate students agreed with above point only 10% postgraduate students considered it as average.
- 6. 46% of undergraduate students agree that ICT usage by teachers as Good. Only. 28 % students considered it as average. 72% of postgraduate students marked it as good only 26 % of postgraduate students marked it as average.

# STUDENTS FEEDBACK ABOUT CURRICULUM (2018-19)

78% of the students considered that syllabus developed life and employability skills. 86% of the under graduate students and 92% of the post graduate students felt that syllabus is easy to understand and career oriented. Most of the undergraduate and PG students agreed that syllabus is related to real life and is applicable in real life. 76% UG students agreed that syllabus provided opportunity for project/ field work, 52% post graduate students agreed for it. 88% of the undergraduate students are satisfied with the clarity, relatedness and availability of resources related to syllabus and 76% PG students agree for above point. 88% of the undergraduate student considered that syllabus is relevant in present context, 72% post graduate students consider syllabus as relevant and 28% post graduate students suggested improvement.
